

Astilbe False Spirea

Spikes of graceful plumes, mostly erect but some arching types. Foliage varies from shiny light green to remarkably dark. Taller varieties can be used for cut flowers. Most Astilbes prefers a rich, moist soil in a semi-shade location. If grown in full sun, give them plenty of water, especially at bloom time.

The Astilbe bloom season extends from early to late summer. Therefore, the varieties marked with an "E" will bloom in approximately the first third of that period, those marked with an " \mathbf{M} " in the second third, and those marked with an " \mathbf{L} " in the last third. Sometimes there is an overlap between bloom times and that is indicated by " $\mathbf{M} - \mathbf{L}$ " for mid to late season.

2016 Shady Acres Perennial Nursery Top 10 List

Are you seeking mindfulness in each moment? How about well-being instead of stress? KEEP CALM and GARDEN ON. Each year, our garden center staff picks ten of our favorite perennials. We are pleased to suggest these plants to help bring harmony to your gardens from spring through fall.

Achillea 'Saucy Seduction' Yarrow is a dependable plant for sunny dry areas, spreading to fill in those tough-to-grow spots. This selection has long blooming fuchsia-pink blossoms that attract butterflies. The flowers are also useful as fresh cut or dried.

Brunnera 'Jack Frost' This perennial adds sparkle to a garden growing in light shade. Tons of little baby-blue flowers appear in spring. Then, the silvery heart-shaped leaves grow larger through the summer, putting on a spectacular display until frost.

Echinops ritro This tall perennial has spherical flowers that are eye catching and truly unique. Their metallic blue color complements other perennials blooming in late summer, like Echinacea and Heliopsis. Beneficial for the bees!

Euphorbia 'First Blush' We love the tri-colored foliage on this plant! A tidy mound of green, cream and pink looks soft and lush all season. The perky yellow flowers in spring are an added bonus.

Geranium 'Biokovo' A great low maintenance perennial. Forms a groundcover of citrus scented leaves that turn reddish in fall. Dainty white flowers touched with pink rebloom sporadically all summer.

Hemerocallis 'Barbara Mitchell' Every garden needs a few easy-to-grow daylilies. This elegant selection has large, soft pink blossoms with ruffled edges. Look for hummingbirds to hover about them!

Heuchera 'Midnight Rose' Coral bells provide fabulous foliage all season long. This one has deep purple-black leaves splashed with pink spots and flecks. Looks fantastic in a container garden too!!

Hosta 'Rhino Hide' The thickest leaves of any hosta! Cupped, puckered blue leaves have a lighter green center and show off the white flowers. Plant in combination with Aruncus, Carex and Tiarella in a partly shady area.

Nepeta 'Walkers Low' The name of this perennial is deceiving...it is not low growing. It is an all-time favorite of ours for its carefree nature, super long bloom time and aromatic foliage. Covered in lavender-blue flowers, bees and hummingbirds adore this plant!

Sisrynchium 'Lucerne' This grass-like perennial is so cute! Its overall size is petite, making it great for edging. The purple-blue, star-like flowers bloom almost continuously and just make us smile [◎]

Shady Acres Perennial Planting Instructions

Due to the differing nature of soil conditions, moisture, and exposure in our area, the following planting instructions are suggestions for successful perennial establishment.

- 1. Soil Preparation: Prepare the soil by mixing 2-3" of compost with the existing soil in the area to be planted. At Shady Acres, mushroom compost and cotton burr compost are available for purchase.
- 2. Planting: Dig the hole twice the size of the pot but no deeper. Carefully remove the plant from the pot. Place the plant into the hole making sure it is at the same depth that it was in the pot. Backfill with the prepared soil. Lightly pack the soil around the root ball leveling off the soil around the plant.
- 3. Water: Following planting, water the plants thoroughly. Be sure the root area of each plant receives ample water. (A root stimulator may be applied. Follow directions on product label.) As the plants become established, water as needed. Weather will determine how often to water. Warm, windy days may require daily watering, while under other conditions water may not be necessary for two days or longer. Check to see if plants need water by sticking a finger into the surrounding soil. If the top 1-2" of soil is dry, watering is recommended.
- 4. Mulch: Apply 1-2" of mulch to the newly planted garden. Keep the mulch away from the crown of the plant to reduce the risk of rot. Cocoa bean shells, pine needles, or a light layer of compost can be used as mulch and are available at Shady Acres.



Mulch Coverage... Generally, mulch coverage is dependent upon soil type and the type of mulch. When applying mulch around plants, keep the mulch away from the crown (base) of the plant to decrease the incidence of rot. Cocoa bean mulch can be applied to a depth of 1", while pine needles can be spread up to 4" deep.
