

Spikes of graceful plumes, mostly erect but some arching types. Foliage varies from shiny light green to remarkably dark. Taller varieties can be used for cut flowers. Most Astilbes prefers a rich, moist soil in a semi-shade location. If grown in full sun, give them plenty of water, especially at bloom time.

The Astilbe bloom season extends from early to late summer. Therefore, the varieties marked with an "E" will bloom in approximately the first third of that period, those marked with an " $\mathbf{M}$ " in the second third, and those marked with an " $\mathbf{L}$ " in the last third. Sometimes there is an overlap between bloom times and that is indicated by " $\mathbf{M} - \mathbf{L}$ " for mid to late season.

**Amsonia 'Blue Ice'** Blue star flowers in spring and summer. Foliage starts green, turning to gold in fall, providing multi season interest. Plant near front of the garden with a dark-leafed Heuchera for contrast.

**Artemesia 'Silvermound'** This is a foliage plant – silvery, soft and aromatic. Create a monochromatic look by planting with white perennials. A true classic...we've been growing this plant since the 1980's.

**Aster novae-angliae** (New England Aster) Native plant, great for prairie areas mixed with coneflowers and grasses. Blooms will attract pollinators from late summer well into fall.

**Brunnera m. 'Looking Glass'** A sea of tiny blue flowers float above silvery leaves in spring. Looks very cheery with blooming daffodil bulbs. Over summer, the heart-shaped leaves on this perennial grow larger. Definitely brightens a shady area.

**Buddleia d. 'Black Knight'** (Butterfly Bush) Plant in full sun, and in soil that has excellent drainage. Butterflies and hummingbirds adore the fragrant, rich purple flowers! These plants get large. If your space is smaller, try Buddleia 'Midnight' – from the BUZZ series.

**Centaurea m. 'Amethyst in Snow'** Silvery-green leaves hold fringed white flowers with purple centers. Perfect for an informal, cottage garden style. Mix with Shasta daisies, garden phlox, lavender and peonies...you will have plenty of flowers for cutting.

**Hosta 'Fire & Ice'** Shady areas will glow with this striking hosta! Leaves have pure white centers surrounded by very deep green margins. Coordinates well planted with spotted-leafed Pulmonaria and bright blooming Monarda.

**Japanese Painted Fern** Provides lovely textural interest for shade to part shade gardens. Let the artistry of the tri-colored silver, green and red foliage shine when planted near simple blue hostas.

**Monarda 'Purple Rooster'** (Bee Balm) A taller variety with clean, sweetly scented leaves. Royal purple flowers benefit pollinators all summer. Creates a colorful display planted with Helenium and Salvia.

**Platycodon g. 'Mariesii'** (Balloon Flower) Slow to emerge in spring, but worth the wait. Balloon buds open to large blue-violet saucer shaped flowers. Deadheading will provide a near continuous bloom!

## Shady Acres Perennial Planting Instructions

Due to the differing nature of soil conditions, moisture, and exposure in our area, the following planting instructions are suggestions for successful perennial establishment.

- 1. Soil Preparation: Prepare the soil by mixing 2-3" of compost with the existing soil in the area to be planted. At Shady Acres, mushroom compost and cotton burr compost are available for purchase.
- 2. Planting: Dig the hole twice the size of the pot but no deeper. Carefully remove the plant from the pot. Place the plant into the hole making sure it is at the same depth that it was in the pot. Backfill with the prepared soil. Firmly press the soil around the root ball leveling off the soil around the plant.
- 3. Water: Following planting, water the plants thoroughly. Be sure the root area of each plant receives ample water. (A root stimulator may be applied. Follow directions on product label.) As the plants become established, water as needed. Weather will determine how often to water. Warm, windy days may require daily watering, while under other conditions water may not be necessary for two days or longer. Check to see if plants need water by sticking a finger into the surrounding soil. If the top 1-2" of soil is dry, watering is recommended.
- 4. Mulch: Apply 1-2" of mulch to the newly planted garden. Keep the mulch away from the crown of the plant to reduce the risk of rot. Cocoa bean shells, pine needles, or a light layer of compost can be used as mulch and are available at Shady Acres.



**Mulch Coverage...** Generally, mulch coverage is dependent upon soil type and the type of mulch. When applying mulch around plants, keep the mulch away from the crown (base) of the plant to decrease the incidence of rot. Cocoa bean mulch can be applied to a depth of 1", while pine needles can be spread up to 4" deep.
