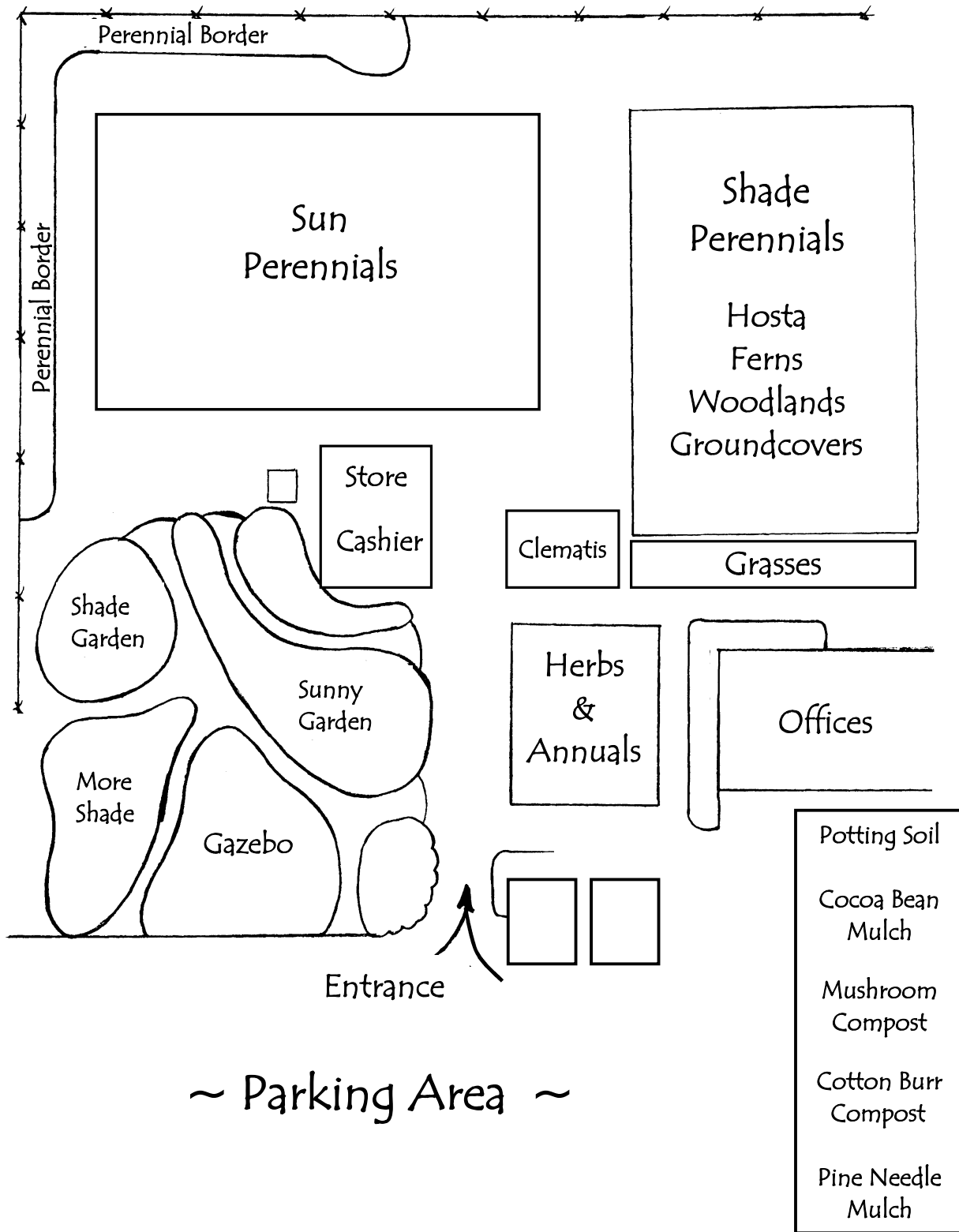

Excellent group of perennials for summer and fall flowers. Easy to grow, dependable plants. All do best in sunny, dry soils. Pinch back through the middle of June to get full, bushy plants in fall.

Astilbe False Spirea

Spikes of graceful plumes, mostly erect but some arching types. Foliage varies from shiny light green to remarkably dark. Taller varieties can be used for cut flowers. Most Astilbes prefers a rich, moist soil in a semi-shade location. If grown in full sun, give them plenty of water, especially at bloom time.

The Astilbe bloom season extends from early to late summer. Therefore, the varieties marked with an "E" will bloom in approximately the first third of that period, those marked with an "M" in the second third, and those marked with an "L" in the last third. Sometimes there is an overlap between bloom times and that is indicated by "M – L" for mid to late season.

Mulch Coverage... Generally, mulch coverage is dependent upon soil type and the type of mulch. When applying mulch around plants, keep the mulch away from the crown (base) of the plant to decrease the incidence of rot. Cocoa bean mulch can be applied to a depth of 1", while pine needles can be spread up to 4" deep.

We love all things green! It's the color that connects us to nature. In the perennial garden, here are many textures, shapes and interesting combinations of leaves...as well as flowers.

Try one of our staff favorites....

Allium 'Millennium' Forms an upright clump of slender shiny deep green leaves. The rose-purple globe flowers attract pollinators to your summer garden. ~ Jim

Amsonia hubrichtii Shrub-like perennial with fine feathery foliage. Blue star-shaped flowers appear in spring, but most showy in fall when the foliage turns a rich golden yellow. ~ Jeanne

Asarum europaeum Attractive groundcover for shady areas. The dark green leaves are round, glossy and leathery looking. ~ Susan

Heucherella 'Pink Fizz' (PP26947) Fancy coloring lasts all season. Deeply lobed leaves are soft green with purple veining. Long lasting bubblegum pink flowers. ~ Lori

Hosta 'Earth Angel' Large size leaves are blue-green with wide creamy yellow margins. Makes an impressive specimen in your shade garden.

Panicum v. 'Apache Rose' (PP29142) Tall ornamental grasses add movement to sunny areas. This one has blue-green foliage and pink sparkler type flowers in late summer. ~ Bev

Polemonium r. 'Stairway to Heaven' (PP15187) Variegated leaves are green and white with tinges of pink. Perfect for part shade spots to add a bit of brightness. ~ Shelly

Sedum 'Lemonjade' (PP26448) Sturdy, thick grey-green leaves are topped by unique pale yellow flowers in late summer. Easy to grow in full sun. ~ Ben

Tanacetum 'Robinson Red' Bright green, ferny foliage holds tall stems of crimson-red flowers. Great for cottage gardens and cutting. ~ Gail

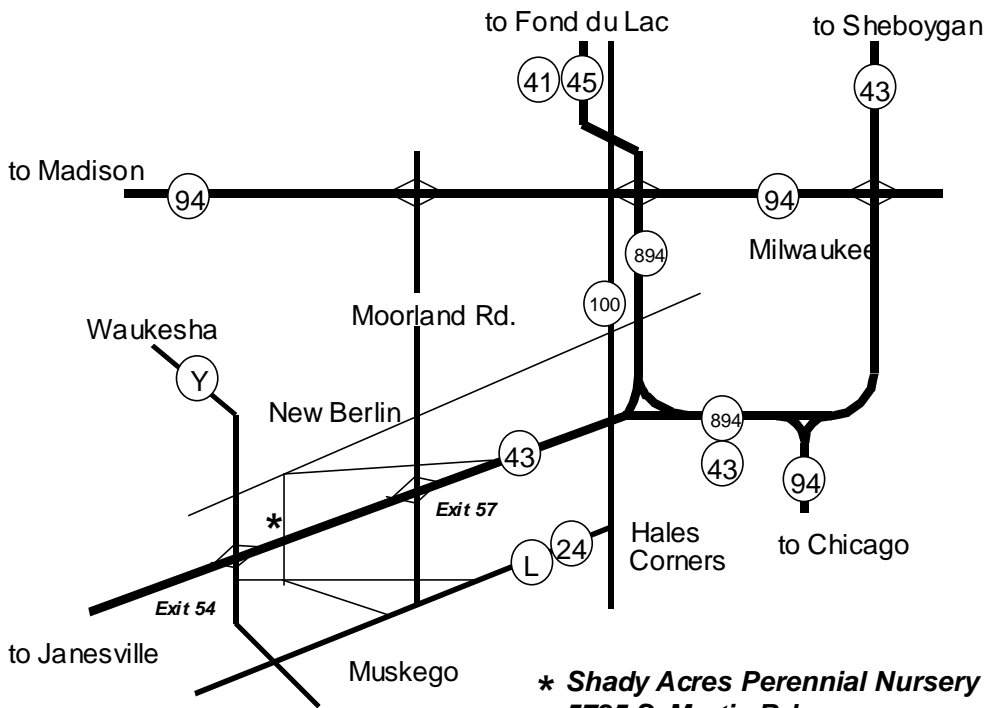
English Thyme (herb) Tiny, dark green leaves are aromatic. A useful herb in cooking, but also makes a pretty filler in containers or a cute edging in a perennial border. ~ Anna

Shady Acres Perennial Planting Instructions

Due to the differing nature of soil conditions, moisture, and exposure in our area, the following planting instructions are suggestions for successful perennial establishment.

1. **Soil Preparation:** Prepare the soil by mixing 2-3" of compost with the existing soil in the area to be planted. At Shady Acres, mushroom compost and cotton burr compost are available for purchase.
2. **Planting:** Dig the hole twice the size of the pot but no deeper. Carefully remove the plant from the pot. Place the plant into the hole making sure it is at the same depth that it was in the pot. Backfill with the prepared soil. Firmly press the soil around the root ball leveling off the soil around the plant.
3. **Water:** Following planting, water the plants thoroughly. Be sure the root area of each plant receives ample water. (A root stimulator may be applied. Follow directions on product label.) As the plants become established, water as needed. Weather will determine how often to water. Warm, windy days may require daily watering, while under other conditions water may not be necessary for two days or longer. Check to see if plants need water by sticking a finger into the surrounding soil. If the top 1-2" of soil is dry, watering is recommended.
4. **Mulch:** Apply 1-2" of mulch to the newly planted garden. Keep the mulch away from the crown of the plant to reduce the risk of rot. Cocoa bean shells, pine needles, or a light layer of compost can be used as mulch and are available at Shady Acres.
